According to a classification scheme(1), an estimated BCF of 3(SRC), from its water solubility(2) and a regression-derived equation(3), suggests the potential for bioconcentration in aquatic organisms is low(SRC).

The Koc of 2,2'-bipyridine is estimated as 160(SRC), using a log Kow of 1.5(1) and a regression-derived equation(2). According to a classification scheme(3), this estimated Koc value suggests that 2,2'-bipyridine is expected to have moderate mobility in soil(SRC). 12.50ther adverse effects

Product
